Paul J. Randolph AWCS (NAC) USNR Retired.

Quoted from his obituary that appeared in the Daily Press on January 14, 2001. "Paul J. Randolph crossed over Friday, Jan. 12, 2001, peacefully in his sleep, at home. Born in Bay St. Louis, Miss., on Oct. 15, 1950, he had been a Peninsula resident since 1963. Paul retired from

the US Navy after 26 years of service."

NOTICE of By-law Changes

There were several changes to the by-laws proposed, voted on and approved during the business meeting held during the recent reunion. The main points were:

- 1. Alumni over the age of 70 can join the alumni association for a single life membership payment of \$ 25.00
- 2. Membership annual dues received after November 1 of any year will cover the following full year (maximum of 14 months)
- 3. The category of Honorary Associate Life Membership was added.
- 4. An appropriation limit was imposed allowing no one to incur expenses in the name of the association without prior approval of 60% of the elected officers.
- 5. Annual membership remained at \$10 for 2001.
