News from Marion C. Price Trust Fund

Happy New Year! My wish for all of you this year is for health and happiness in 2025. WOW 2025!! It has been 25 years since we "partied like it's 1999" and waited anxiously to see what happened in the world as we started the year 2000. I remember people predicting the end of the world and all computers crashing as we turned from 1999 to 2000. As we all know, none of that happened and the world moved on.

This past year has been good to me. My son graduated from Penn State and accepted a job in Florida. We moved him down in July and although I miss him, he's excited about his job and adjusting well. My husband and I also have a warm place to visit in the winter. My daughter is still attending college at Penn State Hazleton and doing well. She spent the three weeks between Thanksgiving and Christmas doing her clinical work in physical therapy at a local nursing home in Mt. Carmel. Although she enjoyed the clinical aspect, she had an awakening as to the loneliness and sadness for some of these nursing home residents.

Trinity began an Advent project two years ago to support our local nursing home residents. Cora Gamelin-Osenbach stopped in my office one day after reading an article on how little the nursing home residents were supplied in the way of toiletries. The items they did receive were often generic, non-smelling items and cheap one-ply tissues. She asked what I thought about collecting some items to donate to those residents in need. This became Trinity's Advent project. In 2023, sixty bags were filled and delivered to Rosewood Rehabilitation and Nursing Center.

In 2024, the project was expanded to include the other Episcopal Churches in Schuylkill County. Due to the increase in donations, one hundred bags were filled and delivered to Ridgeview Healthcare and Rehabilitation Center in Shenandoah. In deciding where the bags will go, the Schuylkill County Ombudsman is contacted to find out which facility has the greatest need. I was not there to see the residents' faces when they received those bags, but I can imagine the joy they felt by not being forgotten at Christmas. I would like to thank you all, from the bottom of my heart, for making those residents feel loved. Thank you to those who organized, sorted and packed the items, assisted in delivery and especially everyone who made a donation.

I visit the nursing homes of Schuylkill County, and I enjoy saying hello, smiling or chatting to lonely residents. If you are ever looking for something to do, try visiting a nursing home. Some of the people there just need a friend to talk to. By visiting, you can provide brightness to their day, relief from loneliness, and make them feel special. The joy you feel in your heart after visiting may be greater than the joy you give.

Donations as well as visits are welcome anytime at nursing homes. A local facility posted on Facebook, looking for Christmas decoration donations, so residents could decorate their rooms. I'm sure this would work for any holiday, so next time you want to downsize your decorations, consider donating to a local nursing home. If you have costume jewelry you no longer want, or gifts you receive that are just not your style, consider donating them to be used for BINGO prizes at a nursing facility. Please consider donating your time, talents or gifts this year to our elderly population.
