ADVENT PROJECT 2024

Last year an Advent project was initiated by Trinity to collect items for nursing home residents. A newspaper article discussing how many people in nursing homes have very little disposable income prompted this project. Many needs are fulfilled by the institutions, however items which we consider everyday essentials are not provided.

In 2023 this project was spearheaded by Trinity, but this year after interest was expressed from all the Episcopal churches, this project can now have more far-reaching effects. A total of 60 bags of items were delivered to Rosemont Nursing home last year — a great success! Just imagine what can happen in 2024 with all churches participating and hopefully with outreach to more nursing homes.

We take for granted each day when we use toothpaste, toothbrushes, combs, razors, lotions, etc. These are the very ordinary items which will seem like a personal luxury to nursing home patients who may have very little money left over for such items.

Beginning in October, there will be boxes in each church to collect items. At the beginning of December, all items will be collected and bagged in holiday style for distribution. Cathy Clouser will work with the County Ombudsman's office to determine where the greatest need is.

Please donate FULL items only (specifically travel size)— not half used lotions or shampoos that you may have used at a hotel. And please check for expiration dates on toothpastes, etc.

These are some of the items we are looking for (you may add something to the list if you think they are useful):

- Toothpaste and toothbrushes
- Shampoos and conditioners
- Body lotions, hand lotions
- Travel tissues
- Nail files
- Disposable razors
- Mouthwash, breath mints
- Combs
- Hand wipes, bathroom wipes
- Hand sanitizer
- Lip balm

What a joy for these special people to receive a brightly colored bag with items for personal use! And what a blessing for those of us who have donated knowing we are making a difference in Christ's Love! Thank you — God bless you!

NEWS FROM MARION PRICE TRUST FUND

We have all heard the phrase "it takes a village". This quote apparently originated from an African proverb emphasizing the importance of community in raising a child. Typically, it is used in reference to raising children with the help of others, such as family, friends, teachers, church family, and community. Those who are parents may agree it takes many hands to raise a child.

Do we lose "the village" after our children are raised? I hope not because I still rely on a village to help me get through life. I have family, friends, church family, work family, and neighbors that help me navigate through good and bad times. I also may seek advice from doctors, dentists, accountants, lawyers, and even my hairdresser. It seems that as we age, we may become more dependent on "a village".

A group in California has recognized the need for communities that act as "a village" to support their growing older population. The Village Movement California is expanding the village model of care to allow their older adults to age well. Villages are neighbor-based membership organizations that connect older adults to the community, programming, and expertise they need to continue living lives of purpose and promise while remaining in their own homes. The model got its start in the late 90's and has grown to an estimated 300 villages across the country. The master plan includes 5 goals: *housing for all stages and ages, * health reimagined, *inclusion and equity, not isolation, *caregiving that works, and *affording aging (economic security). While the program charges a membership fee it is widely supported by neighbor helping neighbor and volunteerism. What a wonderful concept!

Following this example can we create an Episcopal village? NO, not actually building new houses but using this concept utilize neighbor helping neighbor and volunteerism. Wouldn't it be great to use your time and talent to help others? This would not be just one-sided for the active. It would be a give and take not limited by age or physical status. This is how it could work- I would compile a list of what you are willing to volunteer to do and match up with needs expressed by others. For example.... if you need lightbulbs changed or small home repairs, I can match the need with someone who volunteered to do that. If you need some clothing mended, I will match you up with someone that volunteered that talent. Maybe you are willing to drive someone to the doctor or store, make fresh baked cookies or homemade soup or bread, help someone do their taxes, knit a scarf, rake leaves or just volunteer for any need that arises and you are capable of doing. What is HOSPICE care? Hospice care is a type of healthcare that focuses on the palliation of a terminally ill patient's pain and symptoms and attending to their emotional and spiritual needs at the end of life.
